# One-Week Curriculum: Legal or Equitable Rights in Land (Our PDF Based)

#### Day I — Foundations of Legal vs Equitable Rights

- **Core Topic:** Difference between legal and equitable rights; why the distinction matters.
- **Key Statute:** Law of Property Act 1925 (s.l).
- **Activity:** Write a short note explaining why legal rights bind the world automatically but equitable rights may need protection (notice/registration).

### Day 2 – Legal Estates (Ownership Rights)

- **Core Topic:** Two estates capable of existing at law:
  - Fee simple absolute in possession (freehold)
  - Term of years absolute (leasehold)
- **Key Statute:** LPA 1925, s.l(1).
- **Activity:** Create a comparison chart of freehold vs leasehold estates with examples.

# ${\bf Day\,3-Legal\,Interests\,(Rights\,Over\,Another's\,Land)}$

- **Core Topic:** Easements, profits à prendre, mortgages, rentcharges, rights of entry.
- **Key Statute:** LPA 1925, s.l(2).
- **Activity:** Take the Aisha scenario (Oakridge Manor). Identify which rights Leo, Dr North, Shepherd Karim, and Meridian Bank hold, and classify them.

### Day 4 — Formalities for Legal Creation

- **Core Topic:** Deed requirements and exceptions.
- Key Statute:
  - o LPA 1925, s.52 (deeds requirement).
  - o LP(MP)A 1989, s.1 (valid deed).
  - o Exception: LPA 1925, s.54(2) (short leases).
- Case: Walsh v Lonsdale.
- **Activity:** Draft a checklist of the 4 requirements of a valid deed. Then explain how short leases differ.

#### Day 5 — When Formalities Fail: Equitable Rights

- **Core Topic:** How rights become equitable (defective deeds, estate contracts, trusts, proprietary estoppel, incomplete registration).
- **Case:** Parker v Taswell (equitable lease).
- **Activity:** Solve a problem: If a 6-year lease deed was signed but not witnessed, is it legal or equitable? Explain with reasoning.

#### Day 6 — IRAC Problem-Solving

- **Core Topic:** Applying IRAC to determine legal vs equitable.
- Example Scenario:
  - Right of way for life  $\rightarrow$  equitable easement.
  - o Right of way for 20 years by deed → legal easement.
  - o Restrictive covenant → always equitable.
- **Activity:** Practice with the Sofia, Jacob, Lila, and Ravi scenario (garage lease, orchard path, restrictive covenant). Write out a full IRAC answer.
